WHO WE ARE

<u>Noora Health</u>'s mission is to improve outcomes and strengthen health systems by equipping family caregivers with the skills they need to care for their loved ones. Founded in 2014, Noora Health turns hospital hallways and waiting rooms into classrooms by tapping into the most compassionate resources available for the patient's care: their own family.

With the support of six state governments in India, the Government of Bangladesh, and large private hospital systems, Noora Health has trained more than two million caregivers across 329 facilities. In a cohort of patients, the program reduced post-surgical cardiac complications by 71%, maternal complications by 12%, newborn complications by 16%, and newborn readmissions by 56%.

Noora Health was honored as a <u>TED 2022 Audacious Project Grantee</u> and recipient of the <u>2022</u> <u>Skoll Foundation Award for Social Innovation</u>. Featuring Edith Elliott and Shahed Alam, our Co-Founders and Co-CEOs, Noora Health's mission took the spotlight at <u>TED 2022</u> and was also featured in a <u>2022 Skoll video</u>.

Noora Health's goal is to expand its current work in India and to serve patients where we will develop, launch and implement a context-specific, needs based, interactive, and adaptable intervention. As a Training Manager you will design, develop and deliver training in Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana states mainly and also support training elsewhere based on the need. You will also work closely with the training team based in Bengaluru, supporting them in any project requiring your need. You are, based on the need, expected to work closely with the implementation teams of the respective states in ensuring successful implementation, monitoring and supervision of the flagship program called the Care Companion Program (CCP).
